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## LIBRARY SERVICES:

The library is staffed from 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. The facility is open to members of the Olin community 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, by using an ID card. Access to electronic library resources and more information on library services and policies can be found on the Library website at: <http://library.olin.edu>.

The library provides access to a **collection of books, journals, indexes, databases, and other resources** in electronic and print formats. Subject areas include engineering, science, technology, math, physics, art, photography, design, creativity, and pedagogy. Print resources can be searched in the catalog at <http://library.olin.edu/catalog.aspx>. Books may be borrowed for four weeks using the self-checkout station at the main desk.

Through agreements with other area college libraries, Olin community members may borrow and access materials from **Babson and Wellesley Colleges**.

**Reference assistance** is provided via drop-in, e-mail, IM or scheduled appointments.

**Research consultations** can be scheduled for individuals or teams. Help with database use and other in-depth instruction is available. Library, subject, database, and course guides are under continuous development and are available on the library website.

The library can acquire or borrow materials (books/articles) from other libraries or document providers through **interlibrary loan** or **document delivery** services.

**Course support** is available through reserves, course-specific resource guides, tailored library instruction, web page development, bibliographic analysis of student work over time, and curriculum or assignment development involving information literacy.

**Information fluency** is promoted through library instruction. Online modules for competency-level research skills are being developed in support of college-wide academic goals. In-class customized library instruction can be requested by faculty.

The library develops **educational exhibits** in the library that promote college ideals and highlight curriculum-related themes or special topics of interest.

The library serves as a resource to inform the Olin community about current issues and hot topics such as **copyright guidelines**.
